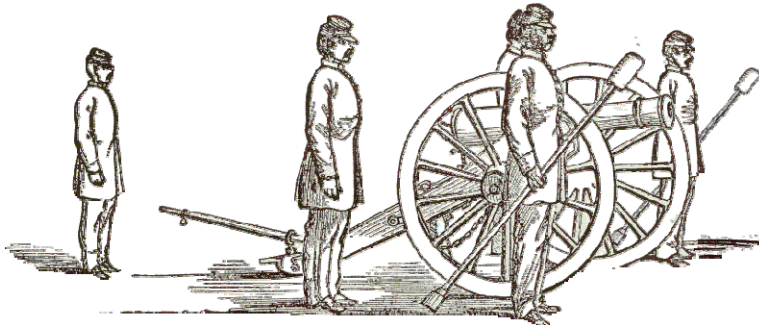

About the Florida Artillery School:

The Florida Artillery School sponsors the muzzle-loading artillery school of the Loyal Train of Artillery Chapter of the United States Field Artillery Association at Ft. Sill, Oklahoma, the home of the US Field Artillery. It teaches the drill, safety, and operation of muzzle-loading artillery to reenactors and ceremonial artillerists, as well as to those interested in learning more about muzzle-loading artillery.

There are two courses taught by the Florida Artillery School:

1. *The Basic Course of Instruction* is also referred to as The School of the Piece. This course is designed to teach the procedures for each position of a cannon crew. Students are taught: nomenclature and care of artillery pieces and equipment; drills for loading, firing, and servicing the piece; procedures for clearing misfires; procedures for rolling, preparing, and storing charges; and, safety procedures for operating the piece and maintaining a safe firing range.
2. *The Advanced Course of Instruction* is also referred to as The School of the Battery. This course is designed for Officers and Non-Commissioned Officers who will command sections and batteries. This course includes instruction on commands, procedures, and the strategies for deploying artillery during re-enactments and tacticals.

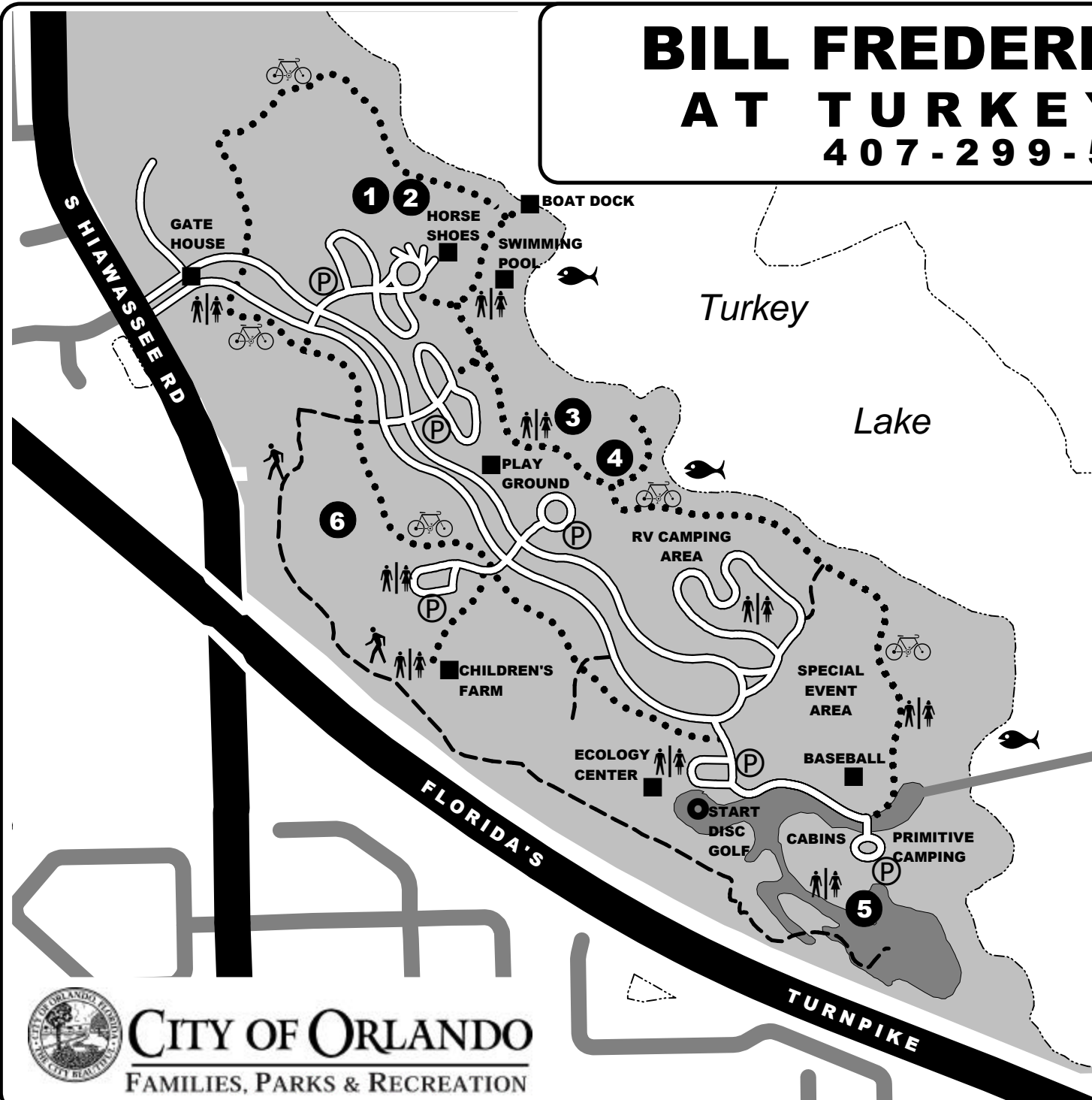
